My background within education includes a range of leadership positions in London, South Auckland and Northland. Within Northland my positions have included Principal at Otamatea High

School in Maungaturoto for 7 1/2 years, Director of Learning Support at Kamo High School and Deputy Principal at Mangakahia Area School last year. I am enjoying the challenge of taking on this principal position whilst the new Board looks to appoint a permanent principal and I believe that this is providing much needed continuity for the school.

2023 was a year of tremendous change as the staff lifted expectations for our students. Students, staff and whānau can attest to the positive shift in school culture which took place over the course of the year. The 16 new students which represent 13 new families are already benefiting from a more settled school. In 2024, we are collectively continuing the journey and invite all students, staff, whānau and community members to be in the waka with us - paddling in the same direction.

At the outset of the school year, we held a pōwhiri for new staff and students. The Manukura Wahine, Anahera Kaipo, led the karanga whilst the Manukura Tane, Rangiatea Marsh, performed the role of whaikōrero, alongside Matua Morgan Peeni. At the pōwhiri, we heard and accepted the challenge to engage with the community, to embrace te Ao Māori and to ensure that our students know what it means to live by the school values. This aligns well with my vision for young people which is to be strong in their identity as this sets the platform for them realising their true potential - academically, culturally, in the arts and on the sporting field. It also aligns with the school's Mana Potential journey where the school values of Pono, Whakamana, Manaakitanga and Matauranga are actively taught and encouraged.

At the pōwhiri I shared the wonderful NCEA results from 2023 and these have also been proudly displayed on the school sign over the last couple of weeks. Of the senior students who were at school for the full 2023 academic year, 91% of year 11 students gained NCEA Level 1 and 100% of year 12 and 13 students gained NCEA Level 2. We didn't have any students working towards NCEA Level 3 last year but this year we have 3 year 13 students who are working towards NCEA Level 3 and University Entrance.

Whilst a few of our senior students have left the school to pursue employment or further education it is encouraging that most of them have made the decision to continue their NCEA journey into years 12 and 13. I have no doubt that experiencing academic success was instrumental in their decision to stay at school. In 2024 we will continue to raise the bar by encouraging students to gain an endorsement (14 credits) in each of their courses and aim for Merit and Excellence grades.

The process for student leadership is well underway and on Wednesday 28th February our 3 students who have been nominated to represent the student body on the Board of Trustees will deliver a speech to the school. All students in years 9 - 13 will then vote for their preferred candidate. We have also received nominations for Rangatira positions at the school and have elected students on the Student Council and as Student Librarians. On Thursday 7th March at 2pm we will be holding a celebration assembly followed by a barbecue to recognise NCEA success and student leadership.

Included in this first newsletter for the year are introductions of the new staff, important posters such as the Kaupapa of Learning, the importance of attendance, uniform expectations and the new 6 Cs. These have all been outlined to the students and will continue to be referenced throughout the year. Of course, there are some awesome photos of what the students have been involved in over the last few weeks. We are planning to use the school Facebook page more often this year, so make sure you check that out to keep informed of all that is happening at the school.

You will know that from Term 2 all schools in the country need to introduce a cell phone procedure which incorporates 'away for the day' practices. As staff we have discussed this, and I will take a recommendation to the Board for final approval at next week's meeting. Once this is confirmed, whānau will be notified of the new process.

I'm looking forward to seeing you at the celebration assembly and barbecue on Thursday 7th March at 2pm. You are also welcome to attend the Board of Trustee meetings at the school. The next meeting is at 5pm on Wednesday 28th February in the school library.

#### BEFORE EACH LESSON

- ★ Be a self-manager eg, before coming to class turn off your cellphone and leave it in your bag with your earphones, go to the toilet and/or drink some water
- ★ Be prepared come to class in the correct uniform and with the correct equipment (stationery, books, PE gear)
- \* Be punctual to class
- ★ Wait outside quietly and sensibly. When the kaiako asks you to enter, take your seat and get your equipment out ready to learn

#### DURING EACH LESSON

- \* Show respect for yourself, each other, your kaiako and the kura
- Be a learner each tauira has the right to learn without distractions
- \* Be focussed quiet hum in class

#### AT THE END OF EACH LESSON

 Be responsible - assist with packing up the classroom, leaving it tidy for the next class

#### AT ALL TIMES

- The kaiako decides how long each activity lasts, when it is time to pack up and when you are able to leave the class to go to your next class
- Take responsibility for our own actions and acknowledge your mistakes
- \* Always work to best of your ability

We had a delivery of Duffy books come in for our junior class. The primary students, below, are showing us the books that they get to keep.



If you are arriving late, please sign in at the admin office. If you don't sign in, you may get a text that your child is absent as it won't be recorded.

Every single day counts towards your child's learning at school and gives them the best chance to do well in life. Whānau play a big role in helping their child do well in school by making sure they attend every day and by letting the school know if they're sick.

Regularly attending school helps students to get the most out of their education.

Vests for the school community. We are fortunate to have had this opportunity and are appreciative of the relationship we have formed with Rotary.


It is extra special having our school logo and the Rotary Emblem on each high Vis Jacket. They range in size from XXXS to XXXL so there is one for every person at every occasion.






